On August 13, 2013, at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, LTC Marshall Clapp, who is a SCA Life Member, had the distinct honor of swearing in his great grandson, Nathan Marshall Reed as a member of the US Navy. This swearing in ceremony was especially a proud time for LTC Clapp; because, he also had the pleasure of swearing in his son, Ronald Clapp, and his grandson, Joel Marshall Reed. Not many people have had this remarkable privilege. LTC Clapp said, "It was a very happy day for me, and it brought back some very pleasant and fond memories of the days I swore in my son and my great grandson's dad". LTC Clapp enlisted in the military and served as a combat engineer. He obtained the rank of E-7, and the ranks of E-8 and E-9 had not been established at that time when he was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the Infantry Corps.
